## THE POSITION: Food Justice Education Coordinator

The Ecology Center seeks someone who is deeply motivated to inspire knowledge of urban food systems for people of all ages and skills through food justice education. The Food Justice Education Coordinator will work closely with the Education Manager to develop and teach workshops for youth and older adults, manage our small food justice garden, and conduct outreach activities with the broader Lower East Side community. The Food Justice Education Coordinator must be committed to environmental justice and be comfortable interacting with a wide-range of individuals from a variety of social, ethnic and organizational backgrounds.

# **PRIMARY RESPONSIBILITIES**

- Develop and facilitate workshops about food systems and food justice for people of all ages, with a primary focus on older youth (ages 16-24), elders (ages 55+), and intergenerational groups. Topics include but are not limited to growing and cooking food, nutrition, waste, equity, and soil health.
- Support the maintenance of a small food garden including planting, watering, pest management, and harvesting.
- Supervise up to 10 Summer Youth Employment Program (SYEP) interns for 6-weeks.
- Support a community engagement project to collect information about the Lower East Side's food systems, including participation in community engagement training and surveying residents.
- Support the planning of a food justice panel in fall 2025.
- Track participation and programmatic data and write program reports as needed
- Assist with other Ecology Center programs and activities as needed

### **CORE SKILLS AND EXPERIENCE**

- At least 2 years of experience as a non-formal educator
- Strong familiarity with urban agriculture, food systems, and food justice
- Demonstrates a commitment to diversity, equity and inclusion
- Ability to work with and effectively communicate with a wide range of audiences including: staff, community
  and city agency partners, volunteers, youth and adult participants, the general public
- Team player that is self-directed with a can-do attitude, organized, and able to manage multiple tasks
- Enthusiasm and comfortability working outdoors in all kinds of weather conditions
- Complete physically demanding tasks and be comfortable lifting items up to 50 lbs
- Willingness to support other teams and program areas as needed
- Comfortable with Mac OS, Microsoft Office, and Google Drive apps

### ADDITIONAL SKILLS AND EXPERIENCE PREFERRED

At least two years of higher education experience

- Bilingual skills, especially in Spanish, Cantonese, or Mandarin
- Comfortable with being flexible and adapting to change
- Demonstrated mentorship and leadership skills
- A valid driver's license and experience driving in NYC preferred

## **SCHEDULE**

This is a seasonal position and the number of hours will vary by season. The Food Justice Education Coordinator will begin in early April 2025 and the role will conclude in mid November 2025.

- Spring (April June): 15-20 hours per week, 2-3 days per week
- Summer (July August): 35 hours per week, Monday Friday
- Fall (September November): 15-20 hours per week, 2-3 days per week
- This role may require occasional evenings and weekends

# **COMPENSATION AND BENEFITS**

This is a part-time, seasonal position. The rate for the position is \$23-\$25/hour based on experience. The Ecology Center offers paid holidays, 25 hours of safe/sick time off, and 25 hours of personal time off.
